- The public sector employs around 5.6 million people across the UK
- The largest employer in the health sector is the NHS which employs more then 1.7 million people in the UK
- As the third largest employer in the UK the teaching and education sector has a lot to offer graduates.
- Police Officers work closely with members of the criminal justice system, social workers, school, local businesses, health trust, housing authorities, town planners and community groups to provide advice, education and assistance to those who wish to reduce crime or have been affected by crime.

A career within the education sector can mean teaching students from all ages and backgrounds. You can look forward to doing a job which provides fresh challenges and the opportunity to meet an electric mix of people every day.

The social Work sector can be one of the most rewarding sectors to work in and make a real difference.

Allied Health Professionals (e.g Therapists, Dieticians and Radiographers) provide treatment that helps transform peoples lives. They may work directly with a patient to develop some interactive therapies to aid recovery, or other professionals such as GP's, hospital doctors, teachers or social workers.

Uniformed Services	The armed forces and emergency services are made up of people in a vast array of roles, in both the public and private sectors	This pathway can lead to careers in the Police, Fire and Rescue Service or the Armed Forces	A wide range of qualifications will be accepted, with a combination of A Levels and BTECs
Nursing and Paramedic	Providing either an immediate response to a medical emergency or longer-term care for specific conditions	•	You are recommended to choose subjects from A Level Biology, Chemistry, Psychology and BTEC Health and Social Care and Applied Science
Physiotherapy	Physiotherapists work with patients to identify and improve their movement and function, injury or disability	This pathway will be of interest to those aspiring to become a Physiotherapist or Sports Therapist	You may wish to consider studying A Level Biology alongside Chemistry, Maths or Physics but you can also study BTEC Sport, Applied Science
Psychology, Therapy and Counselling	Aim to reduce distress and improve psychological well-being or help people to independently carry out everyday tasks or occupations	This pathway can lead to clinical Psychologist, Counsellor or Occupational Therapist.	Recommended subjects are A Level Psychology, Biology, Chemistry, Maths or Physics.
