Why study Economics?

Economics is the study of the way we make choices in a world where resources are scarce. It affects every aspect of our lives and helps us understand the dilemmas faced by individuals, societies and governments when making decisions. The subject content explores Britain's underlying strengths, problems and the issues of today, and makes comparisons with countries in Europe and the developing world. Theory is applied to current events and so is studied in a meaningful and topical fashion. Examples of topics covered are:

- How can government policy be implemented to tackle climate change?
- Is the dominance of companies such as Amazon and Google good for society?
- How are car producers managing the transition away from fossil fuels?
- What strategies can developing countries use to reduce poverty?
