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Careers Education Programme Outline

Stockton Sixth Form's Strategic Priorities are to:

- 1. Provide students with opportunities to receive personal advice and support tailored to their needs, from both internal staff members and external agencies. Students will have access to and receive personal guidance from a qualified Careers Adviser from Youth Direction and one-to-one support from their tutor and Faculty Manager.
- 2. Embed equality and diversity considerations in to our programme, ensuring the needs of each student are met.
- 3. Ensure students are able to pursue opportunities that link subject teaching to careers/employment, through the curriculum, our tutorial programme, off-site organisational visits and work experience opportunities.
- 4. Provide students with the opportunity to speak with external speakers, FE/HE providers and apprenticeship providers; ensuring students have access to a range of learning opportunities including attending university visits and apprenticeships talks/visits.
- 5. Give students the opportunity to experience the workplace and meet employers and employees.
- 6. Develop each students' understanding of the labour market via a range of forums.
- 7. Be transparent to all by ensuring our programme is accessible to all.
- 8. Collect and maintain destination information, keep systematic records of advice given, opportunities available and obtain regular student evaluations.
- 9. Engage and inform parents of future study options via parents evenings, meetings, letters and college updates on our website.

We adhere to the Career Development Institute's Code of Ethics which include impartiality, confidentiality, transparency and competence and these will be integrated into our Careers Programme in line with our strategy and the Gatsby Benchmarks; ensuring careers initiatives deliver a highly regarded student experience across the whole curriculum, raising aspirations, challenging stereotyping and promoting equality and diversity.
